

on the proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on population and housing censuses (COM(2007)0069 - C6-0078/2007 - 2007/0032(COD))

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SHORT JUSTIFICATION

This opinion for the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs concerns the Commission proposal for a European Parliament and Council regulation on population and housing censuses (COM(2007)0069), to be adopted under the codecision procedure (2007/0032(COD)).

The main aim of the draft regulation is to clarify and make comparable the data collected in censuses carried out in the individual Member States of the European Union, in particular with regard to housing.

The provision by the Member States of coherent, complete and reliable data is essential to the development of credible indicators giving an accurate assessment of the socio-economic situation at regional, national and European Union level.

The importance of reference dates for the collected data and Member States' punctuality in transmitting data to the Commission (Eurostat) should also be stressed in this regard, as only when data relating to the same period of time is available for each territorial unit simultaneously can we genuinely compare information and produce reliable overviews and analyses.

The rapporteur rightly stresses the need to harmonise the system for providing data based on common standards applicable to all Member States and mentions the technical and procedural difficulties encountered in the process.

It should also be borne in mind that these statistics and overviews on population structure and characteristics constitute a fundamental indicator in the planning and monitoring of cohesion policy and in assessing the effectiveness of the implementation of the Structural Fund. The classification of regions for the purpose of this very fund is based on data concerning the populations of those regions, meaning that there are direct financial consequences both for regions and for Member States


The proposal for a regulation under discussion in this opinion concerns issues that are fundamental to the development of regional and cohesion policy.

It should also be underlined that, while census data concerning people's place of usual residence is integral to assessing the housing situation, in the case of analyses of other aspects the focus should be on other data, for example country of citizenship, sex, age or number of children.

Some concepts are not clearly defined in the draft regulation, such as 'place of usual residence', which should refer to a specific period of time preceding the reference point, i.e. the date of the census. Attention should also be given to the accuracy of the translations of the text.

AMENDMENTS

The Committee on Regional Development calls on the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs, as the committee responsible, to incorporate the following amendments in its report:



Amendment 1 Recital 2

- (2) Periodic statistical data on the population and on the main family, social, economic and housing characteristics of individuals are necessary for the study and definition of regional *and* social policies affecting particular sectors of the community;
- (2) Periodic statistical data on the population and on the main family, social, economic and housing characteristics of individuals are necessary for the study and definition of regional, social, and environmental policies affecting particular sectors of the community. It is necessary, in particular, to collect precise data on housing to support various Community activities such as promoting social inclusion and monitoring social cohesion at regional level or protecting the environment or promoting energy efficiency;

Justification

The European Union has no competence in the field of housing policy. Data on the housing situation are needed, however, in connection with the formulation of Community policies on social integration and cohesion, environmental protection and energy efficiency.

Amendment 2 Recital 3

- (3) In order for the most judicious use possible to be made of the data in drawing comparisons between Member States, such data should refer to a given year to be defined;
- (3) In order to ensure the comparability of the data provided by the Member States and for reliable overviews to be drawn up at Union level, the data used should refer to the same reference year;

Justification

This rewording is intended to make clear the link between the need for data to be provided for the same reference year and the basic requirement for comparability with regard to the overviews produced at Community level.

Amendment 3

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- (4) In accordance with Council Regulation (EC) No 322/97 of 17 February 1997 on Community Statistics which constitutes the reference framework for the provisions of this *regulation*, it is necessary that the collection of statistics conforms to standards of impartiality, reliability, objectivity, scientific independence, cost-effectiveness, and statistical confidentiality;
- (4) In accordance with Council Regulation (EC) No 322/97 of 17 February 1997 on Community Statistics, which constitutes the reference framework for the provisions of this *Regulation*, it is necessary that the collection of statistics conforms to standards of impartiality, *transparency*, reliability, objectivity, scientific independence, costeffectiveness, and statistical confidentiality;

Justification

It is important to make the point that statistics should be collected in the Member States in a transparent way, bearing in mind that the procedures will not be harmonised.

Amendment 4 Article 2, paragraph 1, point (a)

- (a) "population" means the national *and* regional population at its usual residence at the reference date referred to in Article 5(2);
- (a) "population" means the national, regional, *and local* population at its usual residence at the reference date referred to in Article 5(2);

Justification

The local population as such, i.e. of a municipality or local authority area, must likewise be covered by statistics.

Amendment 5 Article 2, paragraph 1, point (b)

Amendment 6 Article 2, paragraph 1, point (c)

- (c) "usual residence" means the place at which a person normally spends the daily period of rest, regardless of temporary absences for purposes of recreation, holiday, visits to friends and relatives, business, medical treatment or religious pilgrimage; or, if not available, the place of legal or registered residence;
- (c) "usual residence" means the place at which a person normally spends the daily period of rest, regardless of temporary absences for purposes of recreation, holiday, visits to friends and relatives, business, medical treatment or religious pilgrimage. *Only those persons:*
- (i) who have lived in their place of usual residence for a continuous period of at least twelve months before the reference date; or

(ii) who arrived in their place of usual residence during the twelve months before the reference date with the intention of staying there for at least one year

should be considered as usual residents of the geographic area in question.

Where this cannot be established, "usual residence" means the place of legal or registered residence.

Justification

For reasons of further clarity in the definition of "usual residence", a reference to a specific timeframe needs to be included. It is suggested that a twelve-month reference represents the minimum period of time that one person would need in order to regard one place as "usual residence". Therefore, this addition can better contribute to the provision of more accurate information and data in the censuses in question.

Amendment 7 Article 2, paragraph 1, point (g)

Does not apply to the English version.

Amendment 8 Article 3

Member States shall submit to the Commission (Eurostat) data on the population and on housing covering determined demographic, social, economic and housing characteristics of individuals, families, households, housing units and buildings at the national *and* regional levels as set out in the Annex.

Member States shall submit to the Commission (Eurostat) data on the population and on housing covering determined demographic, social, economic and housing characteristics of individuals, families, households, housing units and buildings at the national, regional, and local levels as set out in the Annex, making sure of the reliability and quality of the data they submit and ensuring that they are punctual in providing it.

Justification

The basic criteria for the data collected should be explicitly mentioned at the outset.

Amendment 9 Article 4, paragraph 2

- 2. Member States shall ensure that the data
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sources and the methodology used to comply with the requirements of this regulation meet the essential features of population and housing censuses as defined in Article 2 (1) to the highest possible extent.

sources and the methodology used to comply with the requirements of this regulation meet the essential features of population and housing censuses as defined in Article 2 (1) to the highest possible extent, enabling data to be produced that are as coherent, complete and reliable as possible.

Justification

The basic quality criteria for the data provided should be stressed, as this is a precondition for the drawing-up of reliable overviews and comparisons of data at Community level.

Amendment 10 Article 4, paragraph 3

- 3. Member States shall take all measures necessary to ensure the quality of the data and metadata transmitted. The Commission (Eurostat), in cooperation with the competent authorities of the Member States and international organizations, shall provide methodological recommendations and requirements designed to ensure the quality of the data and metadata produced, in particular the Conference of European *Statisticians* Recommendations for the Censuses of Population and Housing.
- 3. Member States shall take all measures necessary to ensure the quality *and accuracy* of the data and metadata transmitted. The Commission (Eurostat), in cooperation with the competent authorities of the Member States and international organizations, shall provide methodological recommendations and requirements designed to ensure the quality *and accuracy* of the data and metadata produced, in particular the Conference of European *Statisticians*' Recommendations for the Censuses of Population and Housing.

Justification

Accuracy is intrinsic to the quality required of the data produced in Member States.

Amendment 11 Article 5, paragraph 7

- 7. In cases of revisions or corrections according to Article 4 (5) of this regulation, the Member States shall transmit the modified data *without delay* to the Commission (Eurostat).
- 7. In cases of revisions or corrections according to Article 4 (5) of this regulation, the Member States shall transmit the modified data to the Commission (Eurostat) at the time of publishing the revised data at the latest.

Justification

The place and the space available for each member of a household, and the quality of that space, are central to analysis of the quality of life that populations have. The extent to which environmental and energy standards match social requirements also serves to measure quality of life.

Amendment 15 Annex, paragraph 2.2.1, indent 8

- Water supply and sanitation system

Justification

Access to basic sanitation networks as well as to water supply networks can entail patent differences in social situations.
