International Conference: International Community and Refugees: Responsibilities, Possibilities and Violations of Human Rights

May 13 -14, 2016 in Istanbul Elite World Otel

Since 2011, at least 10 million people were displaced as a result of the ongoing civil war in Syria. More refugees are under risk of being forced to leave their home countries due to widespread human rights violations in Iran, Iraq, Afghanistan and many African countries.

Five million people from Syria were forced to leave their home country since the emergence of the conflict. At least five million refugees, which are 95% of all Syrian refugees, are hosted in countries neighboring Syria: Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq and Egypt. Currently, Turkey holds the largest number of refugees including 2.7 million from Syria and around 300.000 from other countries. On the other hand, international community including the EU countries has failed to effectively respond to this humanitarian crisis and share responsibility.

Refugees and asylum seekers, who are unable to survive in Turkey due to insufficient access to resources and human rights violations, continue to move irregularly to EU through the Mediterranean and the Aegean Sea in large numbers despite the severely dangerous journeys.

Instead of providing safe and legal routes for refugees to reach Europe, EU is building more fences and strengthening its land and sea border. As the EU-Turkey migration deal presents yet again, EU countries shy away from taking its share of responsibilities to protect refugees. The international community has failed to respond effectively to what we call the largest refugee crises since the World War II.

At least six million people, who are internally displaced due to ongoing armed conflicts in Syria and Iraq, are far from accessing their basic human rights and needs.

The local actors, who are trying to meet the millions of people's needs, who must have been to be displaced as a result of the ongoing conflict in Syria and Iraq, have difficulties in getting a sufficient help from international society.

By the initiative of Ban Ki-moon, General Secretary of UN, "United Nations World Humanitarian Summit" is going to take place first time in history on 23-24 May 2016. Official delegations as well as international and regional organisation officers, parliamentarians, NGO members, academicians and media members are going to gather and discuss humanitarian aid policies.

Following the finalization of programme and speakers information will be presented to attendees.


