

## Introduction

---

### About the GES

The Global Economic Symposium (GES) is a high-level solution forum organized annually by the Kiel Institute for the World Economy, a renowned Think Tank in the field of global economic affairs, in cooperation with well-known international partner institutions. Established in 2008, the GES challenges leading international decision-makers from academia, business, politics, international organizations and civil society to develop new solutions to major global problems.

Due to their global dimension, the challenges addressed at the GES cannot be solved by national policy instruments alone, but require global cooperation and dialogue. Examples of these challenges are financial crises, climate change, energy security, poverty and inequality, unemployment, migration, education deficits, or deficient global governance.

The GES seeks to initiate such cooperation and dialogue by providing an ongoing strategic process, in which the global community generates ideas, develops visions and pursues concrete projects. The process is supported by a research base provided by researchers from the Kiel Institute for the World Economy. The outcomes of each GES are summarized in various publications. The most promising solutions proposed at the GES 2014 are presented in the "GES Selected Solutions 2014/15," which is available for download.

### General Information

The GES 2015 will take place in Kiel, Germany, on October 12-14, 2015. The overarching theme will be "Values to Guide Economies," as we see an urgent need to explore common values in order to support and guide sustainable and equitable growth. There is growing evidence that global problem-solving processes have often come to a stand-still due to unbridgeable differences in the underlying values of the various players.

GES sessions are divided into four thematic clusters:

- Financial Regulation and Stability
- Environmental Sustainability
- Societal Development, Integration and Equality
- Innovation and Prosperity.

Contributors are asked to deliver well-defined, implementable and action-oriented solution proposals to their specific challenges. The most promising solution proposals will be published.
