**Invitation to the Green Cross study tour 2014 to Japan
for Ms Julie Ward**

Dear Sir or Madam,

Green Cross Switzerland is one of 32 national affiliates of Green Cross International, which was founded by Michail Gorbachev in 1993 to foster global value shift toward a sustainable and secure future by reconnecting the humanity with the environment. We have established an international social and medical care programme for children, young people and their parents with the aim of improving living conditions in contaminated areas (www.greencross.ch). After the reactor accident in Fukushima 2011, Green Cross Switzerland together with Green Cross Japan immediately started projects to spread knowledge about dealing with radiation exposure and contaminated food.

For the second time we have organized a Green Cross study tour to Japan from October 1st to October 8th 2014. The goal of the Study Tour is to inform about the current situation in the Fukushima region after the nuclear accident in March 2011 and how the problems can be best addressed e.g. visit the Green Cross projects helping the people and the environment in the contaminated areas. The schedule includes the visit to the deserted city Tomioka, 10 km from the damaged reactor in Fukushima, the participation at the international conference on nuclear technology in Tokyo and talks with leading Japanese politicians. The participants gain an insight into Green Cross' programs for enhancing the life situation of people affected by the reactor damage in Fukushima visiting our family clubs in Fukushima und Koriyama (200 km to the north of Tokyo) and the population that has been evacuated from Tomioka to Koriyama.

We are glad to report that the Study Tour has interested over 30 persons. Among them were two Swiss MPs, one Canadian MP, a former chief of staff of a United States Senator, public health specialists, journalists from Scotland, Sweden, Korea and the United States as well as interested private persons. Furthermore, we were especially honored that Ms Julie Ward, as a Member of the European Parliament was able to take part in this significant trip. She was an important asset for the study tour.

Hereby, we would like to confirm that Green Cross Switzerland has officially invited Ms Julie Ward to the study tour and has fully covered her costs of accommodation, transportation, food and flight.

Information

This study tour is organized by Kuoni in close co-operation with GREEN CROSS and the local Destination Management Company Hankyu Travel exclusively for the participants listed at the back of this booklet.

TOUR CONDUCTOR / SUPPORT

During this study tour you will be accompanied by Mrs. Nathalie Gysi, Executive Director and Mrs. Maria Vitagliano, Program Director for Social Medicine, GREEN CROSS SWITZERLAND. Participants arriving on October 1 or 2 will be welcomed at Narita Airport by a representative of our local partner Hankyu Travel, displaying a Green Cross board and guiding them to the transfer vehicle. Participants scheduled to arrive before or after the mentioned dates will receive separate information.

MEALS INCLUDED

Daily breakfast at the hotel plus lunches and dinners from October 2 – 7, 2014 are included; with each meal, bottled water, tea or coffee is provided.

SERVICES NOT INCLUDED

Expenditures of a personal nature, such as further beverages, mini-bar, laundry, telephone calls, souvenirs, etc.

Travel Preparations

ENTRY FORMALITIES: PASSPORT / VISA / CUSTOMS

For your entry to Japan, citizens of the European Union, South Korea, Switzerland and the U.S.A. need a passport which is valid minimum 1 day beyond completion of the trip; no visa is required for a stay of up to 90 days. If you are a National from another country, you might need a visa: please check the following website:

http://www.mofa.go.jp/j_info/visit/visa/short/novisa.html or ask us as early as possible. Compliance with immigration regulations remains the full responsibility of each participant.

Upon arrival in Japan, all foreigners are requested to provide fingerprints of both forefingers and to have a passport-type photograph taken. A refusal of such identification measures from your side would lead to your entry being denied.

TIP

Make a copy of all important documents and keep these separately and within easy reach. This will make the process of creating new documents easier in case of loss.

TRAVEL PHARMACY, MEDICINES

If you require specific medication for personal use, please bring with you your doctor's prescription and medicines in their original packaging, including package insert.

VACCINATIONS

No vaccinations are currently mandatory for entry to Japan, when arriving from Asia, Europe or North America. In general, reasonable protection against tetanus, polio, diphtheria and measles as well as hepatitis A is advisable when travelling abroad. Most vaccinations must be renewed every 10 years. CLIMATE

October is a typical autumn month in Japan. Central Hoshu Island, including Tokyo and Kyoto are part of the temperate climate zone with an average day temperature of 20° Celsius (68° F), cooling down to approximately 13° C (55° F). Rainfalls are expected on an average of 3 days per week. Humidity is decreasing during the month while the number of sunny days increases.

CLOTHING

For the temperate climate in October similar clothes as you would wear in Barcelona, New York or San Francisco will be suitable. For air-conditioned zones at airports and hotels as well as on board the aircraft or train, a pullover or a light jacket may be useful. One or two opportunities for swimming await you at a hotel or on a beach; we recommend you therefore to bring along your bathing suit.

LUGGAGE

Most airlines allow passengers in Economy Class to check in 1 piece of luggage (up to 20 or 23 kg = 44 or 50 lbs and a limited sum of length, height and width of 158 cm = 62 in) and to take 1 piece of luggage (6 - 10 kg) into the cabin (dimensions for carry-on baggage being limited to 55 cm length, 40 cm height, 20 cm width, corresponding to 22/16/8 in). Usually the allowance is doubled for passengers in Business Class. For detailed information please check your e-ticket receipt or the website of your chosen airline.

If you are booked together with the Group on Aeroflot Russian Airlines out of Switzerland, you will find the conditions for excess

luggage/weight/dimensions on:

The cabin luggage should mainly include valuables, personal documents, travel documentation, reading material, keys and medicines. Dangerous objects, such as weapons, stunning devices and objects with a sharp point or sharp edge, such as scissors and knives, needles and tweezers are not allowed in your hand baggage. Such objects will be confiscated by security.

The amount of liquids, aerosols, gels and creams is restricted to 100 ml per container. The liquids must be stowed in a sealable, transparent plastic bag with a volume of no more than one liter. The plastic bag must be presented separately at the security check (as is also required e.g. for laptops). Only 1 bag per passenger is allowed on board. Slightly different conditions may apply for flights originating on the American Continent.

OVERNIGHT BAG

In view of the limited space on the high speed trains and the planned transfer connection, your suitcase will be sent to your hotel at Narita separately, 1 day prior to your return trip. You are kindly requested therefore to pack necessities for the night at Tsuruga and the following day into an overnight bag on October 6. (Such measure is not applicable for those extending their stay at Kyoto or returning from Osaka).

MONEY MATTERS

The legal currency in Japan is the Yen (JPY= ¥). There are banknotes with a value of 10'000, 5'000, 2'000 and 1'000 Yen as well as coins of 500, 100, 50, 10, 5 and 1 Yen.

Average exchange rates on Sept. 15, 2014:

We recommend that you bring with you, in addition to an internationally recognized credit card, your Maestro/ATM card for cash withdrawals at ATM/Bankomat cash vending machines. A small amount of cash (e.g. 150 EUR, CHF or USD) may also be helpful in some occasions.

VOLTAGE

The voltage is 100 volts, 50 or 60 hertz. Generally, 2-pin American type plugs are available. Participants from outside America are advised to take an international adapter with them.

Important to know

During this trip we will not be exposed to any danger originating from radiation, if we adhere to the following rules:

- Only water from industrially sealed bottles shall be used for drinking.
 - We do not buy any food directly from farmers or street vendors, but enjoy the meals organized by the Tour Conductor.
 - We respect all rules and directives during the trip, particularly in the areas of Fukushima, Koriyama and Tomioka. We abstain from picking up any stones, wooden or metallic pieces, etc. as a souvenir and we move only on paved roads. (We avoid stepping on soil, mud, grass by the roadside as well as on spots overgrown by moose or algae.) We abstain from smoking in contaminated areas.
 - When making use of a dosimeter, make sure that it will not have direct contact with the ground.
 - In the event of upcoming wind in Fukushima, Koriyama and Tomioka, we use the mask provided by the tourleader and wash the hair in the evening.
 - Upon arrival at the hotel, after the visit of Tomioka, we pack the worn clothes into a separate bag (to be laundered first, upon your return home) and we wash the worn shoes with water.

TRAVELLING TO JAPAN

Most airlines (except Aeroflot) are enhancing automated check-in procedures and therefore recommend the use of their online check-in facilities, mostly available within 23 hours prior to departure. Please check the availability of this service on your airline's website. You will have to enter your complete name as mentioned on your passport as well as your booking reference or e-ticket number (indicated on your e-ticket receipt in your travel documents). You may print your boarding card at home, reducing the time needed for traditional check-in formalities at the airport, where you will have to hand over your luggage at the "baggage drop" counter, at least 1 hour before take-off. Please make sure that your luggage is checked-in to Tokyo Narita Airport.

If you choose to check-in the traditional way, at your airline's check-in counter at the airport, please take into consideration the time needed queuing, for security checks and for reaching the gate, according to your airport of departure. We recommend you to reach the check-in counter between 3 hours (USA) and 1.5 hours prior to departure. Most airlines close the check-in counter 60 minutes prior to international departures.

After check-in, please proceed to the security check, the passport control and to the gate corresponding to your flight, as displayed on the monitors.

Regarding your flight details, please refer to the separate flight itinerary and e-ticket receipt in your travel documents.

EARLY ARRIVAL: OCTOBER 01, WEDNESDAY, TOKYO

If your personal flight is reaching Tokyo Narita airport on October 01, you will be met at the exit after customs control by a representative of the share-taxi company "Green Tomato" displaying your name and guiding you to the transfer vehicle that will take you downtown Tokyo. In some instances other participants arrive within the hour and we count on your understanding that the transfer vehicle will be shared. In case you should not find your driver, please call the emergency phone +81 479 782323. Dinner is not included this day.

Overnight at Hotel Monterey Hanzomon, Tokyo.

ITINERARY FOR PARTICIPANTS FLYING FROM ZURICH WITH THE GROUP

OCTOBER 01, WEDNESDAY, ZURICH ~ TOKYO

Individual flight to Zurich according to your specific flight schedule. Please make sure to have your luggage checked-in to Zurich and to claim it upon your arrival. Then, please go through the exit and follow the signs to Check-in 2. New check-in at Aeroflot counter, row 4, which will close 45 minutes before the scheduled departure.

You are travelling with an electronic ticket, i.e. your data are stored in the airline's booking system. Just present your passport.

After your check-in, please proceed through the security and passport control to the gate indicated on your boarding pass, where you will meet the Green Cross tour conductor.

- 13.35 h departure by Aeroflot flight SU2391 (Airbus 320) to Moscow.
Flight duration: 3 hours, 15 min.
- 18.50 h arrival at Moscow Sheremetyevo airport, terminal F.
International transit; change to terminal D.
- 20.00 h departure from Moscow by Aeroflot flight SU 264
(Airbus 330-300) towards Japan. Flight duration: 9 hours, 35 min.

OCTOBER 02, THURSDAY, TOKYO

- 10.35 h arrival at Tokyo Narita airport, terminal 1.
Baggage claim and customs formalities. At the exit, we will be welcomed by our Japanese guide with a Green Cross board, who will guide us to our transfer coach.

INDIVIDUAL ARRIVALS AT TOKYO NARITA AIRPORT

OCTOBER 02, THURSDAY

Participants arriving at Terminal 1 (e.g. Aeroflot, Air France) will join the transfer coach of the group, as mentioned above.

Participants arriving at Terminal 2 (British Airways, Finnair) will be met at the exit after customs control by a representative of the share-taxi company "Green Tomato" displaying your name and guiding you to the share-taxi that will take you to the hotel. In case you should not find your driver, please call the emergency phone +81 479 782323.

Transfer to the Hotel Monterey Hanzomon downtown Tokyo.
A Japanese style lunch will be offered at the hotel.

14.00 h check-in to your room.

14.40 h we leave by coach to the Foreign Correspondents Club at the Yurakucho Denki Building.

15.00-17.00 h we will participate in the „Nuclear Technology Dialogue“, an international exchange on the nuclear power phase-out with information regarding the costs, alternative energy management, energy saving measures and disaster control/civil protection. Return to the hotel.

19.30 h we walk to a nearby restaurant for dinner, returning on foot.

Overnight at Hotel Monterey Hanzomon, Tokyo.

OCTOBER 03, FRIDAY, TOKYO - KORIYAMA/FUKUSHIMA PREFECTURE

08.30 h we start for a sightseeing tour to see some of the most significant buildings, squares and parks of Tokyo.

For the participating politicians an encounter is planned today with Japanese politicians. Details of this meeting will be available with your Tour Conductor.

12.45 h a light lunch is served at Restaurant Ginto in the bustling Ginza district.

14.00 h departure by coach to Koriyama, located approximately 200 kms (3-4 hours) north east of Tokyo. This city is at a distance of 70 kms/44 miles of the damaged nuclear power plant, outside the evacuation zone.

Mrs Maria Vitagliano, Program Director Social Medicine, Green Cross Switzerland, will introduce the Green Cross project work: „Interventionen und Massnahmen in Fukushima“ (a translation to English is provided).

17.45 h arriving at Myukaru-Gakuto-Kan conference center at the Kaiseizan Park, we meet Mr Naka, representative of the people who have been involved in the first instance clean-up works after the reactor accident.

19.00 h a short coach ride to the Koriyama View Hotel, Annex; check-in.
20.00 h dinner at the hotel.

Overnight at Koriyama View Hotel, Annex.

OCTOBER 04, SATURDAY, KORIYAMA – TOMIOKA – KORIYAMA
08.30 h excursion by coach to Tomioka, at a distance of approximately 130 km from Koriyama. This town is located at 10 km/6.5 miles distance from the Fukushima reactor and all 16000 inhabitants had to be evacuated after the disaster. Nowadays the access road to Tomioka is outside the restricted area. At Tomioka we will gain some impressions of the destructive power of the Tsunami and the consequences for the town residents in the aftermath of the reactor explosion. Returning to Koriyama, a light meal is served at a restaurant.

In the afternoon we will meet with people originating from Tomioka, who have been evacuated after the explosion of the Fukushima reactor and live at Koriyama since. Return to the hotel.

19.00 h Prof. Jonathan Samet, Director of the Institute for Global Health at the University of Southern California USC, gives a lecture on the dimensions of the areas irradiated following the Fukushima disaster and the health implications for the population.

Dinner and overnight at Koriyama View Hotel, Annex.

OCTOBER 05, SUNDAY, KORIYAMA – FUKUSHIMA – KORIYAMA
09.00 h we leave from the hotel by coach to the Green Cross Family Club, where you will gain insight into the awareness trainings offered, regarding the effects of radiation and the handling of contaminated foods. We will also meet children and youngsters who have had the chance to participate in a Green Cross Summer Camp in order to recover from the stress of radiation, through sports, games and fun. Lunch at the Restaurant La Cucina.

13.00 h our coach will take about one hour to reach Fukushima City, 90 km/56 miles to the north-west from the damaged reactor, outside the restricted area. In the Capital of Fukushima Prefecture - the most affected by the reactor explosion - you will visit a second Green Cross initiated family club, where the main focus is on how to cope with the implications on health. Another stop is planned at the emergency unit of the regional hospital, where many of the victims of nuclear disaster are treated. Dinner at a restaurant at Fukushima and return to Koriyama. Overnight at Koriyama View Hotel, Annex.

OCTOBER 06, MONDAY, KORIYAMA – TSURUGA

Early breakfast at the hotel. For logistic reasons, the suitcases of those participants flying back from Narita on October 8, will be transported directly to the hotel at Narita. Therefore, please pack your bare necessities for your short stay at Tsuruga and Kyoto into your hand-carried overnight bag.

07.30 h departure by coach, crossing Honshu Island to the north-western Niigata coastline, continuing to Toyama. Enjoy lunch and a break. In the afternoon our journey will continue, following the coast of Kanazawa and traversing Fukui prefecture to Tsuruga. Dinner in the city.

Overnight at Hotel Route Inn Tsuruga-Ekimae.

OCTOBER 07, TUESDAY, TSURUGA – KYOTO – TOKYO NARITA

After breakfast our coach journey continues to Kyoto to explore this former imperial city. We will visit the temple Kinkakuji - “the golden pavilion”, Kiyomizu temple and the shrine of Heian. Another major attraction of Kyoto is a stroll along the bustling Sannen-Zaka Street. We will enjoy lunch at a Sushi restaurant.

Mid-afternoon, the coach will take us to Kyoto Station.

17.16 h departure from Kyoto on board the Shinkansen Nozomi 38 highspeed train to Tokyo. En route, you may enjoy a Japanese style „Bento“ meal.

19.33 h arrival at Tokyo Main Station, track 16. Change trains.

20.03 h continue from track 4 on board the „Narita Express 53“

21.13 h arrival at Narita Terminal 1 railway station.

A short coach ride takes us to the hotel; check-in.

Overnight at Hotel Nikko Narita, nearby the airport.

Participants with an extension of their stay or an individual return trip from Kyoto will take leave of the group after lunch at Kyoto. The continuation of their trip will take place according to a separate itinerary.

OCTOBER 08, WEDNESDAY, TOKYO NARITA DEPARTURE
Individual breakfast at the hotel. Please settle your extras in due time.

PARTICIPANTS WITH AN INDIVIDUAL RETURN FLIGHT

The hotel offers a free shuttle bus to Narita airport, terminals 2 and 1, operating 2 or 3 times per hour (before noontime departures at :25/:45). Driving time is approximately 10 minutes. In view of the important passenger volume at the airport, you are advised to arrive at the check-in counter for your flight at least 2 hours before take-off.
