### **USEFUL INFORMATION**

### MINISTRY OF PLANTATION INDUSTRIES & COMMODITIES

The Ministry of Plantation Industries and Commodities (MPIC) is responsible for the development of the plantation industries in Malaysia namely; oil palm, rubber, timber, cocoa, tobacco, kenaf, pepper and sago.

In performing its task, MPIC is supported by six statutory bodies and five councils. These include the Malaysian Palm Oil Board and the Malaysian Palm Oil Council. Apart from the established plantation commodities such as oil palm, timber, rubber and cocoa, MPIC is also exploring the development of new sources of growth including kenaf, sago and jatropha, which have economic potentials to the country's economy.

To further enhance the development of the plantation industries, MPIC has formulated the National Commodities Policy for 2011 – 2020. The policy is targeted to transform the commodity industry to be more dynamic and competitive through greater production of high value-added commodity-based products.

### MALAYSIAN PALM OIL BOARD

The Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB) is a premier government agency entrusted to serve the country's oil palm industry. Its vision is to strive for quality R & D outputs and to become Malaysia's first R & D institution to produce a *Nobel Laureate*.

MPOB's main role is to promote and develop national objectives, policies and priorities for the well-being of the Malaysian oil palm industry. It was incorporated by an Act of Parliament (Act 582) and established on May 1<sup>st</sup> 2000, taking over, through a merger, the functions of the Palm Oil Research Institute of Malaysia (PORIM) and the Palm Oil Registration & Licensing Authority (PORLA). Each of these organizations has been directly involved in the oil palm industry for more than 20 years and it is to render more effective services as well as to give greater national and international focus to the industry that MPOB was instituted.

The Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB) plays an active role in developing new technologies which have contributed to the advancement of the Malaysian oil palm industry. In leading the industry, MPOB provides and promotes strong scientific and technological support through its commitment to R&D, commercialization of its research findings and transfer of knowledge & innovation. It also plays a significant role in matters related to registration, licensing and enforcement.

### THE FEDERAL LAND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

The Federal Land Development Authority (FELDA) was established on 1 July 1956 under the Land Development Ordinance 1956. Its functions as allocated under the Ac (Amendment 1991) are as follows:

- To carry out and implement development projects
- To develop, facilitate and implement development, management and economic, social, agricultural, settlement, industrial and commercial services as well as other related activities in areas where FELDA has been granted the authority to implement land development projects or in areas owned by FELDA and its companies
- To implement activities which can help modernize the agricultural sector in areas where FELDA
  has been granted the administrative authority especially in activities which are related to
  production, processing and the marketing of agriculture and livestock product
- To assist, guide, advice, manage and coordinate social, settlement, agriculture, industrial and commercial activities in FELDA areas

FELDA's vision is to become the world leader of oil palm industry and settlers being a part of the middle income group by 2010. Today, FELDA manages about 811,140 ha of plantations of which 723,394 hectares are oil palms, providing employment to 112, 635 settlers, making it one of the big players in the palm oil industry.

### SARAWAK LAND CONSOLIDATION & REHABILITATION AUTHORITY

Sarawak Land Consolidation and Rehabilitation Authority (SALCRA) was established on May 1<sup>st</sup> 1976, as a Government Statutory Body under the Sarawak Land Consolidation and Rehabilitation Authority Ordinance, 1976.

The formation of SALCRA was to enable and assist the State Government in achieving the objectives of the New Economic Policy (NEP), particularly concerning the eradication of poverty. The idea to setup SALCRA came during the Mid-Term Review of the Second Malaysia Plan (1971-1975), when the Government of Sarawak decided to form another statutory body with the objective of developing and managing NCR land. It was thought that development of NCR land is an appropriate strategy to bring about socio-economic development to the rural areas, hence, enabling the participation of rural communities into the mainstream of Sarawak's development.

### SABAH FORESTRY DEPARTMENT

The Sabah Forestry Department (SFD) was established in 1914 and is responsible for the implementation of Sabah's principal forestry law - the Forest Enactment of 1968. Under this Enactment, SFD oversees the gazettement of forest reserves and their use and management, controls the cutting and removal of forest produce from the state land as well as enforces the Enactment.

SFD vision is make sustainable forest management a reality and in doing so, it manages the State's forest resources in accordance with the principles of sustainable forest management.

### SABAH WILDLIFE DEPARTMENT

The Sabah Wildlife Department (SWD) is under the Ministry for Tourism Development, Environment, Science and Technology of Sabah. SWD is responsible for implementation and administration of the Sabah Wildlife Conservation Enactment 1997. Under this Enactment, SWD strives to conserve a number of protected areas and regulate wildlife utilization in Sabah.

SWD also implements the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) as well as contributes to the implementation of the International Convention of Biological Diversity and to a number of other international, regional and bilateral agreements.

### RAINFOREST DISCOVERY CENTER

The Rainforest Discovery Center (RDC) evolved from a small, cozy environmental education (EE) centre in 1996 into one of Sabah's most popular EE centers. It was officiated on August 10<sup>th</sup> 2007 by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Panglima Abdullah Hj. Ahmad Badawi.

Today, RDC is managed by the EE Unit of the Sabah Forestry Department. Although the main purpose of the RDC remains as an environmental education centre for students and teachers, it has opened its doors to the public since August 2006. Together with the nearby Sepilok Rehabilitation Centre, RDC will help boost tourism in the Sandakan district of Sabah.

### SEPILOK ORANG UTAN SANCTUARY

The Sepilok Orang Utan Rehabilitation Centre was set up in 1964 to rehabilitate orang utans. Located in the lush 4,300-hectare Kabili-Sepilok Forest Reserve, the Centre, which is under the administration of the Wildlife Department of Sabah, attracts tourists and researchers alike; giving them the opportunity to watch the orang utan up close in their natural habitat.

A boardwalk leads visitors to a viewing gallery and feeding platform where the apes are fed with bananas twice a day by the rangers. While orang utan rehabilitation is still the primary goal at Sepilok, it also focuses on public education on conservation, research and assistance on other endangered species such as the rhinoceros.

### ABOUT THE MALAYSIAN PALM OIL COUNCIL



# 'From a single seed was born an industry which employs thousands; from a single seed was born a crop which feeds millions.'

The birth of the palm oil industry in Malaysia can be attributed to a consignment of seeds dispatched from the Royal Botanical Gardens in Kew, England to the Botanic Gardens in Singapore in 1875. More than 10 years later, the popularity of this exotic plant continued to rise and further consignments were brought in.

The first commercial planting of oil palm took place at Tennamaran Estate in Bestari Jaya, Selangor in 1917; laying the seeds for the palm oil industry as it is known in Malaysia today. However, large-scale cultivation in Malaysia did not take off until in the 1960s following the Government's agricultural diversification program, which was implemented to reduce the country's economic dependence on rubber and tin. A key driver for this effort was the Federal Land Development Authority (FELDA), established in 1956 to assume socio-economic responsibilities for developing plantation land for the rural poor and the landless. Today, palm oil has become an important tool for ensuring an equitable distribution of wealth and nutrition throughout the country, accounting for close to 75% of agricultural land under cultivation and playing a key role in the socio-economic development of the rural hinterland.

As the plantation industry blossomed from the colonial era to the present day, various organizations have been formed to represent the interests of relevant sectors. On January 25<sup>th</sup> 1990, the Malaysian Palm Oil Promotion Council (MPOPC), an industry-funded organization, was established and entrusted with the task of consolidating the promotional and marketing activities of the Malaysian palm oil industry in an effort to make it the leading oil in the global oils & fats market. It was later renamed in 2006 as the Malaysian Palm Oil Council (MPOC); reflecting the change in posture from being a promotional centre to a fully fledged council. Tasks undertaken by the MPOC include 'the promotion of the varied techno-economic advantages of palm oil and its by-products and by enhancing the global image of the palm oil industry through effective education of its potential as an environmental sustainable agricultural product.'

MPOC has been internationally recognized as a leading institution for information on all matters concerning palm oil, disseminating information on good agricultural practice, as well as providing support to the industry to share *Nature's Gift to Malaysia* with the world.

Representing an industry of more than 100 years old, MPOC continues to take the leading role in providing thought-leadership on issues relating to sustainable agricultural practices, conservation of the environment, forest, biodiversity & wildlife and renewable energy.
