10 November 2014, Allianz Forum Berlin: Europe at a turning point – How to overcome the new dividing lines?

Europe has reached a turning point. The European Union has been responding with disagreement when confronted with the poly crises (Edgar Morin) which have had an impact on the entire union. The economic and financial crisis has divided the Eurozone into North and South.
