Amendment 12 Article 7, paragraph 1

Access to this programme shall be open, inter alia, to institutions and public or private organisations, universities, research institutes, non-governmental organisations, national, regional and local authorities, international organisations and other not-forprofit organisations established in the European Union. Access to this programme shall be open, inter alia, to institutions and public or private organisations, universities, research institutes, non-governmental organisations, national, regional and local authorities, *religious communities,* international organisations and other not-for-profit organisations established in the European Union.
