

Short bios of speakers on administrative detention and the case of Muhammad Al-Qiq

Charlotte Kates is the international coordinator of Samidoun Palestinian Prisoner Solidarity Network (<http://samidoun.net>), an international network of activists that work to support rights and freedom for Palestinian political prisoners. She is a law graduate of Rutgers School of Law and the coordinator of the US National Lawyers Guild's International Committee (<http://nlg.org>) and an organizer with the Palestine Right to Return Coalition. She has travelled to Palestine on multiple occasions with international delegations, which have included attending the Israeli military trial of imprisoned Palestinian leader Ahmad Sa'adat and meeting with numerous former prisoners and family members of current prisoners. Her writing on Palestine and Palestinian political prisoners has been published in a number of print and online venues, including Electronic Intifada, Mondoweiss, Jadaliyya and Jacobin Magazine.

Mohammed Khatib is a Palestinian activist and journalist. He has served as a Board Member of the Palestinian Youth Organisation (PYO) in Lebanon and was the Youth Project Coordinator for refugees. He has been an active member of the Palestinian community in Belgium for the last five years, and works with the European Coordination of Committees and Associations on Palestine (ECCP). He is currently the European coordinator of Samidoun Palestinian Prisoner Solidarity Network, and a frequent commentator in Arab media on the Palestinian solidarity movement in Europe.
