The new Global Gateway initiative promises investment and partnership between our continents in the field of digital, climate and energy, transport, health, education and research. It is an encompassing strategy that is presented as a new EU development tool to balance the growing influence of China and Russia in the world. But the investment and partnership of the EU in Africa has been growing significantly over the past few years. It begs the question whether this will bring concrete changes, or will it simply remain little more than a public relations exercise. Is the Global Gateway sufficiently attuned to assisting our partners in their green and digital transitions, while upholding human rights, meeting basic needs, and reducing inequalities? Can we assure that the



Global Gateway would not worsen the problem of already dire debt situation in Africa? Given that the initiative aims to mobilise such significant amounts of funding, and the fact that it represents a clear and dramatic shift in the EU's approach towards its partners, it is imperative that we ensure the further clarity on these matters, maintain the EU's credibility and strengthen future cooperation with our partners.
