














The Green Transition in Europe and the Middle East

Introduction

The Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region is a climate change hot spot when compared to other regions around the globe. MENA countries are particularly vulnerable to the effects of climate change as they are naturally affected by harsh climate conditions, extremely high temperatures, limited groundwater, and rainfall, and scarce agricultural and arable land.

The EU-MENA partnership in general, and specifically EU-Israel, has several advantages, benefiting both parties. The EU-Israel collaboration is viewed both as a source for exchanging knowledge and technology to combat climatic changes that are affecting the MENA region and as the EU serving as a mediator to other Israeli collaborations in the region. The EU-MENA collaboration is impacted by recent developments in the global energy market, due to the sanctions on the Russian energy pipeline supply. Those developments have further placed the Middle East in the spotlight, as the EU seeks to diversify its energy supply.


Therefore, it is crucial to discuss the challenges and opportunities for the green transition in Europe and in Israel, as well, as in the broader context of the Middle East, with the view that all parties could benefit from such cooperation. All this is done with the guidance of the European Green Deal, a roadmap for the EU to become climate-neutral by 2050, change its energy system and transform its economy, as well as contribute to the fight against climate change on a global scale.

To address issues as such, an annual EU-Israel Seminar is held, to bring together policymakers, experts, and civil society representatives to analyze pressing issues of common interest in Israel and the European Union, as well as discuss areas and means to deepen the cooperation. The 7th annual EU-Israel Seminar will promote a forum for discussions on major climate and environmental challenges, opportunities, and policy actions. Building on the perspectives of speakers from Europe, Israel, and the Middle East, the seminar will analyze these issues, and identify avenues for cooperation toward the green transition.






