The European Parliament's and political groups' spokespersons will hold a briefing on this week's plenary session at 16.00 today.

The main topics that MEPs will discuss and vote on during the 23-26 November plenary session include:

- Collective interest of consumers
- Strengthening Media Freedom in Europe
- "Right to repair" for EU consumers
- Situation of fundamental rights in the EU
- Debate on 10-11 December EU summit
- Abortion rights in Poland
- Ending homelessness by 2030.

When the moderator gives you the floor, the 'Speak' button will turn blue. Click on the 'Speak' button to ask your question.

Journalists who have never used Interactio before are asked to connect 30 minutes before the start of the press conference to perform a connection test. IT assistance can be provided if necessary.
