Commissioners-designate hearings, plenary and committee meetings, Brussels

Hearings of Commissioners-designate. On Monday and Tuesday, MEPs will continue the public hearings of Commissioners-designate in the parliamentary committees, to examine whether a candidate is qualified both to be Member of the College of Commissioners, and to carry out their assigned duties. MEPs will also assess their ability and willingness to address citizens' concerns and deliver on the programme that President-elect Ursula von der Leyen presented to MEPs in July. Among those to be heard are the three executive Vice Presidents-designate and the High representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy. Plenary

EU summit. MEPs will debate the 17/18 October EU summit, the agenda of which includes the EU long-term budget, Brexit and follow-up to the UN Climate Action Summit (*Wednesday*).

Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF). MEPs will debate and vote on a resolution on the EU long-term budget for 2021-2027 and the reform of the EU's own budgetary resources. In the draft resolution, MEPs say they want the new MFF to go beyond what was previously planned on climate action, to reflect the European Green Deal promised by Commission President-elect von der Leyen (*Wednesday and Thursday*).

Green investments. Measures to make EU investments more environmentally-friendly will be debated with Werner Hoyer, President of the European Investment Bank (*Thursday*).

Foreign electoral interference in Europe. MEPs will vote on a resolution on foreign electoral interference and disinformation in national and European democratic processes, as they threaten the stability of political systems in member states and the cohesion of EU integration (*Thursday*).

2019 Sakharov Prize. The Foreign Affairs and Development committees, together with the Human Rights Subcommittee, will vote to shortlist the three finalists for the 2019 Sakharov Prize for Freedom of Thought. The final laureate will be chosen by the Conference of Presidents on 24 October and announced in plenary by President Sassoli immediately after.

President's Diary. EP President David Sassoli will be in Paris to meet President of the Republic of France Emmanuel Macron and National Assembly President Richard Ferrand as well as visit a "Resto du Coeur". On Tuesday, President Sassoli will be first in Berlin to meet German Chancellor Angela Merkel and Bundestag President Wolfgang Schäuble, and then in London to meet UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson.
