On 9 May 2022, after months of intense deliberations, the Conference on the Future of Europe concluded its work, putting forward a report on the final outcome that includes 49 proposals to the three EU Institutions: European Parliament, the Council of the European Union, the European Commission. The proposals reflect the recommendations and aspirations of European citizens on the future of Europe. The Institutions will now examine swiftly how to follow up effectively on this report, each within their own sphere of competences and in accordance with the Treaties.



The Conference has spoken. Now the guestion is how to turn conclusions into reality. People have a European dream and believe the future of this continent lies in the European Union. But they have criticism on the way it works, or does not work, as shown in the citizens' recommendations. Let's

make the Conference a historic event! The only way to be true to the conclusions of the Conference is to call for a Convention.
